
American Battlefield Trust Park Day is 6 April

Mud Creek line property subject of another rezoning attempt

In 2016, an attempt to rezone a property containing a remnant of the Mud Creek Line was ultimately unsuccessful. See the May 2016 newsletter for details on the initial proposal. The same property is now the object of another rezoning application, Z-4 2019. This time, the amount of land to be developed is considerably less, with 14 of the nearly 24 acres designated as a nature park, which will contain the remnants of the Confederate trench line occupied for two days in mid-June 1864. The property is on the north side of Dallas Highway and the west side of Garrison Commons, not far west of Barrett Parkway.

Georgia Battlefields Association's concern is that other rezoning attempts could follow, so we contacted the attorney representing the developer to ask for a stipulation that the nature park will not be subject to further rezoning applications. The attorney responded that the developer would agree that the property will remain in perpetuity as greenspace. Still, we plan to attend the Cobb County rezoning meetings in February.
