Georgia Battlefields Association will again lead Phoenix Flies tours

Georgia Battlefields Association (GBA) will again lead a Civil War Atlanta downtown walking tour as part of Atlanta Preservation Center's <u>Phoenix Flies program</u>. The free tour will be held on 8 March and again on 22 March. GBA has led tours for Atlanta Preservation Center since 2004 and has led the Civil War Atlanta downtown walking tour every year since 2007.

Return to Chickamauga: GBA annual tour is 27-30 March 2025

Chickamauga is one of two Georgia battles that the 1993 Civil War Sites Advisory Commission report characterized as decisive, its highest rating of significance. Our perception at the end of our 2013 tour focusing on the Chickamauga Campaign was we had covered important though less familiar events during the lead-up to the battle but left perhaps too little time to cover the combat of 19-20 September. Consequently, our 2025 tour will be four days instead of three. Our guide will again be National Park Service historian Jim Ogden. More details of the itinerary are in the October Georgia Battlefields Association newsletter.

Price: As with our 2024 tour, this will be a three-and-a-half-day tour: All day Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, plus Sunday morning. On Wednesday evening (26 March), GBA representatives will be in the hotel lobby to hand out materials. Dinner on your own that evening. The **\$580** price includes bus transportation, handouts, three lunches and three dinners (Thursday through Saturday). 

The January 2025 newsletter mentioned a Rocky Face Ridge 61.54-acre property whose purchase is being spearheaded by <u>Save the Dalton Battlefields</u> and its president, Bob Jenkins, a long-time collaborator with GBA. GBA is contributing \$10,000 towards purchase of the property. GBA presented the check to Bob Jenkins on 1 February at the Dalton Civil War Show in Dalton.
